Second Lt. Allee B. Hogan, I light nurse, 22 Williams, Clinton, has been awarded the Air Medal for outstanding work in evacuating wounded in the Mediterranean I theater.


Cited for "meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight, for professional skill and devotion to duty in evacuating sick and wounded from the combat zone," the lieutenant is a member of one of two medical air evacuation squadrons, components of the wing, who have to date evacuated more than 170,000 patients in that theater.

A graduate of Syracuse University and St. Elizabeth Hospital Praining School, Flight Nurse u Hogan had flown 473 "hospital a hours" at the time of the award. She has served in Africa, Sicily, Z Italy, Corsica and France.
