raised 5 children (all college graduates), earned a BA degree in English and later went on to earn her Master's in Nursing from Texas Women's University when she was in her late 50's!



Edith Delores Ahlgren Bollinger of Atlanta, GA, died on Saturday, March 10, 2012 after a brief illness. The former Hattiesburg resident native was 91 when she passed peacefully from this world.

She was the eldest daughter and only living child of the late Carl and Marion Ahlgren of Hudson, WI. She was preceded in death by her brother, Carl "Bub" Ahlgren and sister, Ethel "Sis" Ahlgren Hanley. In 1938 she graduated with honors from Hudson High School where she was a cheerleader, member of the debate team, and very active: hiking, canoeing, ice skating and swimming the St. Croix

River. She graduated salutatorian from Bethesda Hospital Nursing School in St Paul, MN as an RN and enlisted in the Army Air Corps shortly after Pearl Harbor. She served her country in the South Pacific as a flight nurse in the 801st, was in the first group of nurses on Guadalcanal and helped to set up one of the first air-evac hospitals in New Caledonia and in the New Hebrides. While in the South Pacific, she met and married her husband, Ralph Perry Bollinger of Norman, OK who was a pilot flying with the 13th Air

After the war, Ralph flew for Trans World Airlines (TWA), and later became a petroleum landman. Edith was an extraordinary homemaker and mother to their much-loved family of 5 children, making a wonderful and beautiful home filled with love each of the 28 times the family moved (even to Cairo, Egypt). She led by example in the communities she joined: she was a Cub Scout den mother for two sons, Sunday School teacher, first aid instructor and worked as a RN in Shreveport, LA, New Orleans, Conroe, TX, and Houston. In 1965 she returned to school part-time, and earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in English from St. Mary's Dominican College, Houston, TX. She later earned her Masters Degree in Nursing from Texas Women's University. Along the way, she wrote poetry, painted watercolors and devotedly kept the extended family in touch through correspondence, calls and visits.

She was a former member of Parkway United Methodist Church in Hattiesburg, MS, and attended Peachtree Road United Methodist Church in Atlanta, GA.

Survivors include two sons: Ralph Randal Bollinger, MD and his wife Monika of Durham, NC, William Guest Bollinger and his wife Judy of Singapore; two daughters: Barbara Ann Bollinger, of Atlanta, GA, and Elizabeth Jean Bollinger, of Durham, NC. One son, John Cary Bollinger predeceased her. She cherished her role as grandmother to seven grandchildren: Christie Bollinger Pappas and her husband Keith, Mark Bollinger, Erik Krippner and his wife Faye, Jesse Bollinger and his wife Aree, Kevyn Weiner, Douglas and James Bollinger. She was beloved "G.G." to four great-grandchildren: Joseph Pappas, Luke Pappas, Daniel Pappas, Alex Bollinger, and additionally, loving "Aunt Edith" and "Edith" to numerous nieces, nephews and cousins.

She will be especially remembered for instilling in her children a vision and a passion for "a big world" filled with curiosity, travel, education, new beginnings and new horizons. She embraced a deep-seated belief in family, country and God and "His beautiful world". We will forever remember her singing: "This is my Father's world, and to my listening ears, all nature sings and round me rings the music of the spheres."
